



<p><u>English</u> In English this half term children will be using the video 'The Shirt Machine' to develop their non-fiction writing for explanation texts and instructions, with a focus on using conjunctions to extend and link ideas as well as carefully chosen vocabulary to add detail. They will then be studying the story 'Jim and the Beanstalk' to develop narrative writing, with a focus on incorporating dialogue and using speech punctuation correctly as well as developing sentence openers. In guided reading we will be studying the text 'Race to the Frozen North' by Catherine Johnson.</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> This half term the children will be consolidating their use of written methods for addition and subtraction as well as continuing to learn their times tables with a focus on 3s, 4s and 8s. They will also be learning how to multiply and divide 2 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers, applying their times table knowledge. They will also be looking at measure for length, learning about different units of measure including meters, centimetres and millimetres; finding equivalent lengths; adding and subtracting lengths; and calculating perimeter.</p>	<p><u>Science</u> This half term will focus on Healthy Eating. The unit covers how animals, including humans, obtain nutrition from their diet, emphasising the need for the right types and amounts of food. Pupils will focus on how a balanced diet contributes to overall health and well-being, learning about the different types of food and their roles in the body. It involves asking questions, gathering and presenting data, using scientific language, and interpreting evidence to answer questions and support findings. This unit builds on pupils' prior learning where they explored the importance of exercise, nutrition, and hygiene.</p>
<p><u>History</u> How did the discovery of metal change Britain? In this unit children will make comparisons between the Bronze Age, Iron Age and Stone Age as well as that to modern life; build evidence from a range of sources to display understanding; explain how the discovery of metal changed Britain including looking at the impact on farming and settlements.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Chambersbury Primary School</u></p> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around; align-items: center;">  <div style="text-align: center;"> <p>Spring 1</p> <p>Year 3</p> </div>  </div>	<p><u>DT</u> This half term children will link their learning to work in History to explore, design and make a dwelling in different ways, and evaluate their designs.</p>
<p><u>Music</u> In music this half term children will be learning about the Reggae genre of music, focusing on the song: Three Little Birds. As well as learning to sing, play, improvise and compose with this song, children will listen and appraise other Reggae songs.</p>	<p><u>PE - Dance and Gymnastics</u> In dance pupils will create dances in relation to an idea and develop their use of counting and rhythm. They will learn to use canon, unison, formation and levels. In gymnastics children will develop their balancing, rolling and jumping - using the skills individually and in combination.</p>	<p><u>PSHE</u> Children will continue their learning to identify and discuss feelings, discuss feeling safe and what to do if they are worried and discuss relationships and friendships. The children will also begin to discuss valuing money and how to keep money safe.</p>
<p><u>RE</u> In RE children will explore key events in the life of Jesus and explore the messages and meaning in different religious stories.</p>	<p><u>Computing</u> This unit is called 'We are presenters' and gives children the opportunity to evaluate different camera techniques and commentaries and begin to plan and deliver their own presentations.</p>	<p><u>French</u> Children will continue to develop their understanding of a few familiar spoken words and phrases and say and repeat short phrases. This term will focus on celebrating achievements and special occasions.</p>
