



<p>English</p> <p>In English, Year 3 children will develop a range of writing skills across different genres. When writing a narrative, they will focus on creating clear story structures, using descriptive language, and developing characters and settings. In non-chronological reports, pupils will learn to organise information using headings and paragraphs, write in a factual tone, and include key features such as technical vocabulary. When exploring kennings poetry, children will experiment with figurative language, using descriptive phrases to create vivid images, and build confidence in expressing ideas creatively.</p>	<p>Maths- time, shape, statistics</p> <p>In Summer Term 2, Year 3 children will continue developing their understanding of key maths concepts through units on time, shape, and statistics. In time, they will focus on telling and writing the time using analogue and digital clocks, including using am and pm, and solving problems involving durations. In shape, they will explore properties of 2D and 3D shapes, including angles, lines, and symmetry. In statistics, pupils will learn to interpret and present data using bar charts, pictograms, and tables, as well as answer questions based on the information they collect and analyse.</p>	<p>Science- Light & Shadows</p> <p>In science Year 3 children will explore the science topic of light and shadows. Pupils will identify different sources of light, including the Sun, and understand that light can be reflected from surfaces. They will also investigate how shadows are formed when light is blocked by an object, and explore how the size and position of shadows can change. Through practical investigations, children will develop their observation skills and begin to use scientific language to explain what they notice.</p>
<p>History - How did the Romans impact Britain?</p> <p>This Summer 2 children will learn how the Romans built straight roads to help soldiers and traders to travel quickly. We will also explore how the Romans introduced towns with shops, baths, and strong buildings made from stone. Children will also learn how the Romans helped spread the Latin language and how their influence changed how people in Britain lived, worked, and built their homes.</p>	<p><u>Chambersbury Primary School</u></p>  <p>Summer 2</p> <p>Year 3</p> 	<p>DT - savoury tarts</p> <p>In their Design and Technology lessons, Year 3 children will learn how to make savoury tarts. They will explore different ingredients and talk about which flavours go well together. The children will practise important cooking skills like chopping, mixing, and assembling their tarts safely. They will also learn how to follow a simple recipe and understand basic hygiene rules. At the end of the unit, they will design and evaluate their own savoury tart.</p>
<p>Music- Reflect, rewind and replay</p> <p>In Music the year 3 children will consolidate the learning that has occurred during the year. All the learning is focused around revisiting songs and musical activities, a context for the History of Music and the beginnings of the Language of Music.</p>	<p>PE- Rounders and Rugby</p> <p>In Year 3 Summer 2 PE the children will develop a range of physical skills through rounders and rugby. In rounders, they will practise striking a ball with control, developing accurate throwing and catching, and learning how to work as a team. In rugby, pupils will focus on basic ball-handling skills such as passing and catching, as well as movement, spatial awareness, and simple attacking and defending strategies. Across both units, children will build teamwork, communication, and an understanding of fair play.</p>	<p>PSHE- Changing Me</p> <p>In this term, Year 3 children will explore their thoughts and feelings about growing and changing. They will discuss how they feel about babies and young animals, and begin to understand how their own bodies change over time, including ways to manage any worries or new emotions. Pupils will also consider the importance of keeping their bodies clean and healthy as they grow up. In addition, they will develop skills to express their feelings respectfully, especially when their ideas are challenged, helping them build confidence, resilience, and positive relationships with others.</p>
<p>RE- Special places</p> <p>This term Year 3 will learn about special places in both the Muslim and Christian religions. They will explore places such as Mosques and churches and look at important items to each religion such as prayer mats.</p>	<p>Computing- We are opinion pollsters</p> <p>This term pupils will create their own online opinion poll, seek responses and then analyse the results, creating charts showing data and a brief illustrated report.</p>	<p>French- Growing Things</p> <p>In French, year 3 We will learn to describe different plants and their characteristics in French, using simple sentences and key vocabulary. This will help us build confidence in speaking, listening and understanding the language while developing our pronunciation.</p>
