



<p><u>English</u> In English they will use the text 'Skellig' by David Almond to learn the features of a fantasy narrative. After this they will develop character and setting descriptions and use these to create a short story inspired by 'Macbeth'. Spellings will revise many of the spelling rules covered so far as well as the year 5/6 common exception words.</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> The children will revisit many of the skills and curriculum content covered both in Year 6 and also the rest of Key Stage 2. The learning will explore maths in real life contexts, allowing the children to see how important maths is in all aspects of life with cross-curricular links. For example, including tasks that develop design and technology skills and geographical knowledge. They also provide a great opportunity to explore and develop enterprise.</p>	<p><u>Science</u> In science we will be continuing with our topic on classifying living things by investigating micro-organisms in more detail. We will then be developing our scientific enquiry skills by carrying out investigations linked to this topic as well as other areas of science covered across Key Stage 2..</p>
<p><u>Geography</u> This term the children will be learning How do location and climate shape landscapes and lives across the Americas? They will study the work of artists including Banksy, Rachel Gracey and Kat Campbell. The end piece will be a Banksy inspired print.</p>
<p><u>Music</u> This half term we will consolidate the learning that has occurred during the year. All the learning is focused around revisiting songs and musical activities, a context for the History of Music and the beginnings of the Language of Music. We will also be focussing on learning and performing songs for our end of year production.</p>	<p><u>PE</u> This half term the children will be playing hockey and developing their athletics skills. They will also be developing the skills needed for the events they will take part in for the sports day .</p>	<p><u>PSHE</u> The children will focus on a unit called 'Changing me'. This unit helps children to understand the physical and emotional changes that happen during puberty. It will also explore emotional changes, relationships and how feelings may change as they grow older. Safeguarding, healthy relationships and knowing where to seek support are also key themes throughout the unit.</p>
<p><u>RE</u> This half term, the children will explore Christianity and Buddhism through themes of happiness, suffering, respect and community. They learn how beliefs can influence behaviour and the importance of equality, diversity and living harmoniously with others.</p>	<p><u>Computing</u> In computing they will complete a unit called, 'We are connected' In this unit, the children will use a variety of websites to learn about different aspects of artificial intelligence including machine learning.</p>	<p><u>French</u> In French they will be continuing their learning about the world around us. Through this unit they will revisit some basic everyday vocabulary as well as constructing simple sentences through speaking, listening, reading, singing and writing in French.</p>
