

<u>English- Narrative & Poetry</u> In English, we will develop our narrative writing skills by planning, writing and editing imaginative stories with clear beginnings, middles and endings. They will learn to use descriptive language, varied sentence types, dialogue and punctuation to make their writing engaging. Through poetry, children will explore rhythm, rhyme, imagery, and performance, reading a range of poems and creating their own poems to share aloud.	<u>Maths- Place value, addition and subtraction</u> In maths we will develop the children's understanding of place value by reading, writing, comparing and ordering numbers up to 1,000. We will use hundreds, tens and ones to represent numbers in different ways and practise finding 10 or 100 more or less than a given number. We will also build confidence with addition and subtraction, using mental strategies, number lines and column methods to solve calculations and simple word problems.	<u>Science- Rocks and soils</u> In Autumn 1, we will explore rocks and soils. We will learn to identify and compare different types of rocks, including how they are formed, and investigate their properties, such as hardness, texture and permeability. We will also discover how fossils are made and explore the different layers and types of soil, considering how soils are formed and why they are important.
<u>Geography- Why do people live near volcanoes?</u> We will explore why people choose to live near volcanoes. They will learn about where volcanoes are found around the world, how they are formed and the risks that eruptions can cause. We will also investigate the benefits of living near volcanoes, such as fertile soil for farming, tourism and geothermal energy, and use maps and geographical vocabulary to understand how volcanoes affect people and places.	<u>Chambersbury Primary School</u>  Autumn 1 Year 3 	<u>Art - Pop Art</u> In Autumn 1, we will explore Pop Art and the bold, colourful styles of artists including Andy Warhol, Roy Lichtenstein and Coco Dávez. We will learn how artists use bright colours, repeated images, patterns and comic-style techniques to make eye-catching artwork. We will experiment with these ideas using drawing, painting and printmaking, before creating our own Pop Art-inspired pieces.
<u>Music- Let Your Spirit Fly</u> In Music, we will develop our singing, listening and performing skills through the Charanga unit <i>Let Your Spirit Fly</i>. We will learn to sing the song confidently, listen carefully to different musical styles and identify features such as pulse, rhythm and pitch. We will also explore playing tuned and untuned instruments, perform simple musical patterns and work together to create and share our own musical ideas.	<u>PE- Fitness and Fundamentals</u> In PE, we will develop our fitness and fundamental movement skills through a range of active games and challenges. We will practise running, jumping, balancing, changing direction and coordinating our movements, while learning how exercise can help keep our bodies healthy. We will also build confidence, teamwork and resilience by setting personal goals, working safely and encouraging one another.	<u>PSHE- Being Mr in My World</u> In PSHE, we will explore the theme <i>Being Me in My World</i>. We will think about their role within the class, school and wider community, and learn how our actions can affect others. We will discuss rights, responsibilities, rules and choices, while developing skills such as listening, cooperation and respectful communication. We will also consider how to help create a safe, positive and inclusive learning environment for everyone.
<u>RE- Stories of religious leaders</u> In RE, we will learn about stories of important religious leaders and explore key Christian and Muslim beliefs and practices. We will consider how faith can guide people's choices and actions. We will also develop respect for different beliefs and reflect on the values that are important to us and others.	<u>Computing- E-safety combined with basic skills</u> We will develop our computing skills while learning how to stay safe online. We will practise using digital devices and software confidently, including creating, saving and presenting work. We will also learn about keeping personal information private, using kind and respectful communication, recognising when something online does not feel right and knowing who to ask for help.	<u>French- Me and others</u> We will practise greeting people, introducing ourselves and sharing simple information about who we are. We will develop our listening and speaking skills by learning key vocabulary and phrases, taking part in short conversations and beginning to recognise how French sounds and is written.
